# Dr. Milton "Chip" Routt, Jr., MD Honored with the 2025 Blair C. Filler, MD Lifetime Achievement Award

The Western Orthopaedic Association is proud to announce Milton "Chip" Routt, Jr., MD as the recipient of the 2025 Blair C. Filler, MD Lifetime Achievement Award, recognizing his extraordinary contributions to orthopaedic surgery, trauma care, and surgical education.

A native of Chappell Hill, Texas, Dr. Routt's path to surgical excellence began with his undergraduate studies at Texas A&M University, where he graduated Summa Cum Laude, followed by medical school at the University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston. He completed his surgical internship and

orthopaedic residency at Vanderbilt University, and went on to a fellowship in Orthopaedic Traumatology at the University of Washington's Harborview Medical Center, where he served on faculty from 1989 through 2012.



Over the course of his remarkable career, Dr. Routt has authored over 100 peer-reviewed publications and contributed extensively to orthopaedic literature and education through book chapters and teaching. He is internationally renowned for his groundbreaking work and expertise in the management of pelvic and acetabular injuries, and has mentored hundreds of orthopaedic traumatologists from across the U.S., Canada, and around the world.

His numerous accolades include the 2019 Leonard Tow Award for Humanism and Education, 2018 Memorial Hermann Physician of the Year, multiple Orthopaedic Resident Teaching Awards from both UT Houston and the University of Washington, and the Jack McDaniels Traveling Fellowship. He is also a Distinguished Alumnus of Brenham High School and an Ashbel Smith Distinguished Alumnus of UTMB.

Dr. Routt exemplifies the spirit of the Blair C. Filler, MD Lifetime Achievement Award–honoring not only his clinical excellence and academic impact, but also his unwavering dedication to mentorship, innovation, and the compassionate care of patients.

# Presidential Guest Speaker Mary I. O'Connor, MD



Dr. Mary I. O'Connor will be the WOA 2025 Presidential Guest Speaker. A nationally recognized leader who has championed diversity in medicine, surgery and orthopedics, Dr. O'Connor is Professor Emerita of Orthopedics at Mayo Clinic, as well as past Professor of Orthopedics and Rehabilitation at Yale School of Medicine. She is Co-Founder and Chief Medical Officer of Vori Health, an award-winning, nationwide, virtual specialty medical practice designed to treat musculoskeletal pain more effectively.

After competing as a U.S. Olympic rower, Dr. O'Connor completed her orthopedic residency and fellowship in orthopedic oncology at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN, during a time when few women were accepted into training programs. She was invited to join the staff at Mayo Clinic in Florida and wore many leadership hats throughout the organization. In 2015, Dr. O'Connor was named the inaugural director of the Center for Musculoskeletal Care at Yale School of Medicine and Yale New Haven Health. In 2021, she transitioned from academic medicine to entrepreneurship as co-founder of Vori Health.

Dr. O'Connor has accomplished many "firsts." She was the first female member of the Musculoskeletal Tumor Society (MSTS), the International Society of Limb Salvage (ISOLS), the American Association of Hip and Knee Surgeons (AAHKS) and the first female surgeon in The Knee Society. She has also served as president of the Association of Bone and Joint Surgeons (ABJS), AAHKS, ISOLS, MSTS and the Ruth Jackson Orthopaedic Society (RJOS). She is a former member of the Advisory Committee on Research on Women's Health at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, MD and is previous chair of the AAOS Women's Health Issues Advisory Board and the AAOS Diversity Advisory Board.

# Howard Steel Lecturer Damon West

The WOA is pleased to have Damon West as the Howard Steel Lecturer for our 89th Annual Meeting. Damon West, M.S. Criminal Justice, is an internationally known keynote speaker, 3x Wall Street Journal bestselling author and former crime boss in Dallas, who was sentenced to Life in prison for Organized Crime. USA Today calls him the "modern day Shawshank Redemption and the most in-demand speaker in America."



At 20 years old, he was a Division 1 starting quarterback at the University of North Texas, when he suffered a career ending injury and turned to hardcore drugs to cope with disappointments of life.

After graduation, he worked in the United States Congress and trained to be a stockbroker for United Bank of Switzerland (UBS). One day at UBS, he was introduced to methamphetamines; he became instantly hooked—and the lives of so many innocent people would forever be changed by the choices he made in order to feed his insatiable meth habit.

After a fateful discussion during his incarceration with a seasoned convict, Damon had a spiritual awakening. He learned that, like a coffee bean changing with the application of heat and pressure, he was capable of changing the environment around him. Armed with a program of recovery, a renewed faith, and a miraculous second chance at life, Damon emerged from over seven years of prison a changed man.

On parole in Texas until 2073, his story is one of hope, redemption, grit and the resilience of the Human spirit.
